FIRST PERFORMANCE IN AUSTRIA

In a strange city that is almost entirely underwater, an old man regularly builds a new floor for his house, cubes upon cubes, so as not to see it swallowed up by the waves. He is about to embark on a dive into the depths, bathed in light and nostalgia. A journey to the heart of memory, full of delicacy and poetry, « La Maison en Petits Cubes » is a sensory fable about memory and roots, but also about the climate emergencies that threaten us. It is a bilingual performance in French and French Sign Language. The old man, played by a deaf actor, is the protagonist. His gestural and bodily performance, nourished by sign language, visual poetry and accompanied by video projections, builds a visual narrative that gives life to the character's memories. He is accompanied by the storyteller and the musician.

Visual Theatre presented as an extra-ordinary performance combining Sign Language, Voice as a piece of art.

25.5.2023 "Histoires des Signes / Sign Stories" presented by LES SINGULIERS LIMOGES (Frankreich) in the STUDIO of the Theater Spielraum directed by Philippe Demoulins, performed by Vasily Bubnov, Sylvie Audureau

A duo of actors - one deaf, the other hearing - offer a bilingual interpretation (French and French Sign Language) of stories from children's literature. They bring them to life through voice, gesture, sign and play and make deaf or hearing children discover them in a different way. They offer us their complicity and that of their language to lead us into an artistic experience accessible to all. It is about going beyond simple simultaneous translation to invent a theatrical journey for the two storytellers, a two-voice narration at the service of a subtle and playful incarnation of the characters.

The show uses 4-5 stories that we change from time to time to adjust to the age of the audience.

26.5.2023 "Catastrophe" by Samuel Beckett directed by Herbert Gantschacher, performed by Margot Wutte, Markus Pol, Markus Rupert, Alfred Aichholzer

An autocratic Director and his female Assistant put the "'final touches to the last scene' of some kind of dramatic presentation", which consists entirely of a man (The Protagonist) standing still on stage. The Assistant has arranged the man as she has seen fit

to, atop a "black block 18" high", draped in a "black dressing gown down to his ankles" and – peculiarly – sporting a "black wide-brimmed hat." The bulk of the drama consists of the Director wresting control from her and moulding the man on stage to suit his personal vision. "The Director call for light, both for his cigar which is constantly going out and for the spectacle of the Protagonist on stage."
